# Thoughts on Calling & Praying for a Pastor

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit — just as you were called to one hope when you were called — one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Ephesians 4:1-6 (NIV)

We at First Presbyterian Church have been praying for a pastor to hear God's call to this church and to faithfully respond — and soon. Paul's letter to the Ephesians reminds us that God calls not just pastors but each of us. We are each called to God and for God.

Here are some observations on the above text:

Paul leaves no room for exceptions. He speaks to each member of the church at Ephesus when he refers to the "calling you have received." Just like some pastor out there, you may not be aware of it yet, but you have been called. **There is something God wants you to do.** 

Paul urges those in the church to "live a life worthy of the calling you have received." Our call is something we need to live up to, to be worthy of by being humble, gentle, patient, loving and unified. Nothing is said about whether the calling is worthy of us. If it comes from God, it is worthy. Each call is important. Each call is vital. Each call serves God by serving the church.

Paul says, "You were called to one hope when you were called." This whole brief passage is about oneness and unity. We can assume that this unity already includes that unknown pastor out there. We are each called to one hope, the same hope. We are each called to one purpose, to one cause.

While we wait for a pastor to answer that call, might we consider whether we are faithfully answering our own?
